Simply rinsing your floors after applying a stripper is not enough. Every floor maintenance program should include a floor neutralizer. **BALANCE** contains a carefully controlled combination of pH adjusters and wetting agents. These additives bond with stripping agents left behind during the rinsing process, tying them up and preventing them from eating away at your floor's new finish. This neutralization process ensures the complete removal of alkaline residues and other hazy, gloss-inhibiting contaminants for a richer, deeper shine. Count on **BALANCE** to penetrate deep into the pores of your floor's surface to neutralize stripping agents, remove alkaline residues and help increase the development of an interlocking acrylic matrix -- the most critical element for a strong finish. Remember to apply **BALANCE** before you finish.

## **Directions:**

TO NEUTRALIZE FLOORS AFTER SCRUBBING OR STRIPPING: Use 1 to 3 ounces of **BALANCE** per gallon of water in the final rinse. Allow floor to dry completely before re-coating. TO RINSE RESIDUES OF DEICER PELLETS: Use 3 ounces of **BALANCE** per gallon of mop water. Mop onto floor and pick up immediately.
